

Some of Shakespeares most memorable male characters, such as Hamlet, Prince Hal, and Edgar, are defined by their relationships with their fathers. In *Fathers and Sons in Shakespeare*, Fred B. Tromly demonstrates that these relationships are far more complicated than most critics have assumed. Tromlys introductory chapters draw on both Freudian psychology and Elizabethan family history to frame the issue of filial ambivalence in Shakespeare. The following analytical chapters mine the father-son relationships in plays that span Shakespeares entire career. The conclusion explores Shakespeares relationship with his own father and its effect on his fictional depictions of life as a son. Through careful scrutiny of word and deed, the scholarship in *Fathers and Sons in Shakespeare* reveals the complex attitude Shakespeares sons harbour towards their fathers.
